The Christian holiday of Ascension Day, also known as the Feast of the Ascension, celebrates when Jesus ascended to heaven. It is celebrated by Roman Catholic, Episcopal, Orthodox and Lutheran churches

Ascension Day is generally observed on a Thursday, the fortieth day after Easter. Christian Scriptures (also known as the Bible) record the ascension in Acts chapter 1.
