The Christian holiday of

celebrated by Roman Catholic,
Episcopal, Orthodox and
Lutheran churches
Ascension Day is generally
observed on a Thursday,
the fortieth day after Easter.
Christian Scriptures (also
known as the Bible) record the
ascension in Acts chapter 1.

Date

- Ascension Day always falls on the fortieth day after Easter on a Thursday.
- Check the <u>Calendar Index</u> for Religious Holidays during the current academic year for the exact date.
